Beware of Credit Union National Association Scam

Beware of an e-mail that appears to be sent by Credit Union National Association (CUNA). The new e-mail scam is designed to get you to respond in an effort to acquire sensitive information, such as your name, address, and debit info, from you. If you receive a similar e-mail, do not click through to the site! The text of the e-mail may look similar to this italicized text below:

Credit Union National Association is one of the largest credit union groups in America. In partnership with state credit union leagues, CUNA provides many services to credit unions, including representation, information, public relations, continuing professional education, and business development.

The newest service added at CUNA: Aug. 1, 2008: "Your Credit Union Rewards You" is a new application for our credit union members. Daily 10 random credit union account holders are emailed to take the 300\$ reward. Completing the application forms on our website takes only 5 minutes.
